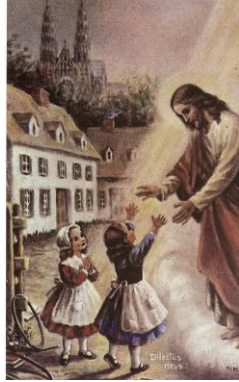

There are people who commit to be in Jesus' presence for an hour so that He is not left alone while in exposition. Anyone can come in for a visit for any amount of time. Just give it a try!

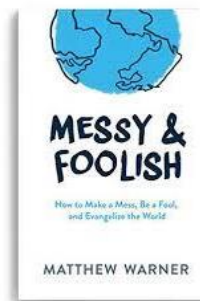


Here are **some ideas** to what to do during Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.

1. Slowly read Sacred Scripture until something hits you. Then listen.
 2. Say the Holy Rosary.
 3. If you can't say five decades, say one decade
 4. If you can't say one decade, say one Hail Mary very slowly.
 5. Look at the Good God, and let Him look at you.
 6. Tell Jesus something that made you happy, sad, afraid, etc. Then listen.
 7. Speak about your loved ones or your enemy.
 8. Talk with Him about work.
 9. Pray to St. Joseph for a happy death.
 10. Pray for the Holy Souls in Purgatory.

Regina Coeli (Queen of Heaven*):

This is the very ancient Catholic custom that has us stop what we are doing to greet our Blessed Mother for a moment (6:00 a.m., noon, 6:00 p.m. daily), as any good child remembers his mother during the day, and to meditate on the Incarnation and Resurrection of our Lord, which give such meaning to our entire existence. The Regina Coeli is said during the Easter season. The Angelus is said during the rest of the year.

- V. Queen of Heaven, rejoice, alleluia.
- R. For He whom you did merit to bear, alleluia.
- V. Has risen, as he said, alleluia.
- R. Pray for us to God, alleluia.
- V. Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary, alleluia.
- R. For the Lord has truly risen, alleluia.

O God, who gave joy to the world through the resurrection of Thy Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, grant we beseech Thee, that through the intercession of the Virgin Mary, His Mother, we may obtain the joys of everlasting life. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
