Dear Friends,

As Catholics we should always seek to deepen our knowledge of the faith. This is why it is often recommended by the saints to take up good and holy books; and when it comes to holy books there is nothing better than the Holy Bible and the Catechism of the Catholic Church. Because as one 'begins to grasp the meaning of his or her faith, the more they come to grasp [and appreciate] their redemption.' (Pope Benedict XVI)

To dedicate a time during the week to prayer is good, excellent in fact; but we should also always seek to dedicate some time to learning. Learning a little more about our faith really helps to live a deeper and more profound prayer life. One that really starts to shape you and your lifestyle according to the path laid out by Christ. GOSPEL Mark 7.31-37 of Sunday Sept. 5, 2021

Returning from the region of Tyre, Jesus went by way of Sidon towards the Sea of Galilee, in the region of the Decapolis.

They brought to him a man who was deaf and who had an impediment in his speech; and they begged him to lay his hand on him. Jesus took him aside in private, away from the crowd, and put his fingers into his ears, and he spat and touched his tongue. Then looking up to heaven, he sighed and said to him, "Ephphatha," that is, "Be opened." And immediately the man's ears were opened, his tongue was released, and he spoke plainly.

Then Jesus ordered them to tell no one; but the more he ordered them, the more zealously they proclaimed it. They were astounded beyond measure, saying, "He has done everything well; he even makes the deaf to hear and the mute to speak."
