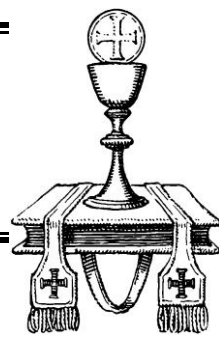

**PASTOR'S MESSAGE**

Dear Friends,

As mentioned last week, this upcoming week we have two very special feast days. The Feast of Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque (Oct. 20th) and Saint John Paul the Second (Oct. 22nd). The first, significant to Sacred Heart Church, and the second (Saint John Paul II) significant to the Institute of the Incarnate Word (IVE).

Saint Margaret Mary, is particularly special to Sacred Heart Church as by her devotion and piety to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, the Church has been named under His Divine Patronage and she (Saint Margaret Mary) is considered Patroness. In this we can have a due honor and gratitude to Saint Margaret Mary for her faith and fidelity of God.

Similar with Saint John Paul II: Since the IVE's beginnings, Saint John Paul II has been considered the Spiritual Father of our Congregation. The IVE was born during his pontificate (on March 25th, 1984). Saint John Paul II has also been an enormous contributor to the Constitution and Spirituality of the Institute; with Encyclicals such as *Redemptoris Missio* (The Mission of the Redeemer) and *Vita Consacrata* (Consecrated Life). And so for this reason we, as the IVE, also feel a great sense of duty to give him great honor and gratitude as well. These two celebrations remind us of the gratitude we have towards the two Saints and to consider their perpetual intercession for us in Heaven. 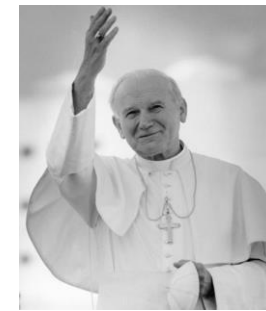
envelopes may be dropped in the collection basket.
