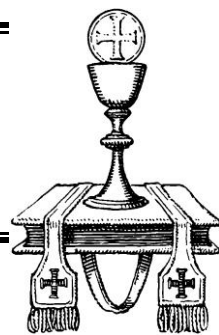

**PASTOR'S MESSAGE**

Dear Friends,

In the Month of November – usually from 1-8th of November - the Church has offered the opportunity to gain a plenary indulgence for the souls in purgatory. And as the Catechism of the Catholic defines it, a Plenary indulgence is “a remission of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven.” (CCC 1471) An amazing act of charity and mercy for those souls in purgatory.

In brief, plenary indulgence removes all temporal punishment, so for a person on earth it would be as though they had just been baptized. If they died at that moment they would go straight to heaven. The Church also gives us the opportunity to obtain a plenary indulgence for souls in Purgatory on All Souls Day, this particular plenary indulgence is only for those souls in purgatory.

This year, because of current situations, the Vatican has extended the possibility to obtain the All Souls Day Plenary Indulgence throughout the entire month of November. (To clarify, it is not that we can obtain 30 indulgences, but that we can obtain 8 indulgences throughout the month of November)

How do I obtain an indulgence? To obtain an indulgence for a family, friend or loved one you are to: (1) visit a cemetery, does not have to necessarily be the cemetery they are buried at, (2) worthy receive communion, either on the same day or within seven days of your cemetery visit, (3) make a good confession, (4) and fourth, prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father (you can pray the Creed and an Our Father).

I highly encourage you to take this opportunity to pray and offer this plenary indulgence for any soul you wish that may be in purgatory awaiting their entrance into heaven.

**GOSPEL Mark 12.38-44 of Sunday November 7**

When Jesus was teaching the crowd, he said, “Beware of the scribes, who like to walk around in long robes, and to be greeted with respect in the marketplaces, and to have the best seats in the synagogues and places of honour at banquets! They devour widows’ houses and for the sake of appearance say long prayers. They will receive the greater condemnation.”

Jesus sat down opposite the treasury, and watched the crowd putting money into the treasury. Many rich people put in large sums. A poor widow came and put in two small copper coins, which are worth a penny.

Then he called his disciples and said to them, “Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put in more than all those who are contributing to the treasury. For all of them have contributed out of their abundance; but she out of her poverty has put in everything she had, all she had to live on.”
