PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends,

This Monday – August 15th - the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. A pious devotion to Mary from the early sixth to seventh century. Tradition tell us that Mary's body never underwent corruption but rather she became dormant and was assumed into heaven both body and soul. As an early Church Father writes: "Mary had died in the presence of the apostles; but her tomb, when opened later . . . was found empty and so the apostles concluded that the body was taken up into heaven."

From the beginning no relics of Mary for veneration has ever been found, and the tomb remained empty on the edge of Jerusalem near the site of what is consider the place of her 'death'. This location now is a place of

pilgrimage; today, the Benedictine Abbey of the Dormition of Mary stands on the spot.

This is believed because Mary, being born without original sin (*Immaculately Conceived*), did not contract the punishments of original sin. As the pains of child birth sickness and death were God imposed penance due to original sin. *Although, Mary would later suffer in her own ways as the mother of the savior of the world.*

In 1950, Pope Pius XII solemnly defined this mystery as a dogma of the Church – the Dogma of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. As Pope Pius states, "The Immaculate Mother of God, the ever-virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heaven."

We know meditate this mystery as the fourth Glorious Mystery. It is called the Assumption because she was assumed - she was taken up to God by the power of God. While Christ, on the other hand ascended into heaven because He is God and so He ascends into heaven by His own power. As He also says in the Gospel of John, "No one has ascended into heaven except the One who descended from heaven— the Son of Man." (*John 3:13*)

Original Sin: The sin by which the first human beings disobeyed the commandment of God, choosing to follow their own will rather than God's will. As a consequence they lost the grace of original holiness, and became subject to the law of death; sin became universally present in the world. Besides the personal sin

of Adam and Eve, original sin describes the fallen state of human nature which affects every person born into the world, and from which Christ, the "new Adam," came to redeem us (CCC 396-412).



GOSPEL Luke 12.49-53 of Sunday August 14

Jesus said to his disciples: "I came to bring fire to the earth, and how I wish it were already kindled! I have a baptism with which to be baptized, and what stress I am under until it is completed!"

"Do you think that I have come to bring peace to the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division! From now on five in one household will be divided, three against two and two against three; they will be divided: father against son and son against father, mother against daughter and daughter against mother, mother-in-law against her daughter-in-law and daughter-in-law against mother-in-law."
