PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends,

The Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Catholic Faith (one of the oldest departments of the Roman Curia and responsible for defending the Catholic Church from Hersey) a few weeks ago came out with a document called "Fiducia Supplicans" which can be translated as 'Begging for Confidence' or 'supplicating trust.' In short, it is a document that presents the permission — not the demand nor the requirement — for priests to bless irregular matrimonial relationships. In some way giving the excuse that such blessings 'could' open a door to those of such situation to enter into the catholic faith.

Promotion of such blessing and consenting to such activities would present a dilemma of inconsistency in God's commands and morality.

Our Lord has disapproved of such behavior throughout the Old and New Testament (Sodom

and Gomorrah [Gen. 19], Leviticus 18:22, Rom. 1:26-27, Jude 7). As we also know, God is all-knowing (Omniscience) and omni-present; this is not only reduced to knowing all things at one moment or instant but knowing all things in every moment in history and future. Therefore, what God spoke in the past also applies to the present, God's Will cannot and does not change with regards to truth and morality.

In defining blessings, the Catechism of the Catholic Church identifies that a proper blessing can be administer for one of two reasons; (1) to invoke God's power upon a person, place or thing to be used to God's Glory and/or (2) to dedicate something or someone to God. (CCC 1671, 2626) Therefore, a blessing cannot be administered with the intent to continue to oppose God will or commandments. It would be as giving absolution in the confessional for a sin someone said they will commit later on in the day. If the church compromises the truth, the one true attraction and calling she has for those who stand in darkness and lies, what else will she be able to offer and where will people go when they do seek the truth.

The temptation of irregular matrimonial state is certainly a difficult temptation for today's society. Thus, it is of great important for us to love the truth, have courage for the truth and to pray for those who struggle with this.

GOSPEL John 1.35-42 of Sunday January 14

John was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he exclaimed, "Look, here is the Lamb of God!" The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus.
