PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends.

The other day we were in class with the RCIA candidates – those preparing themselves to enter into the Catholic Church for this upcoming Easter Vigil – and we came across a part of a video that I thought was very simple and good. It was talking about the third commandment, 'Thy Shall keep Holy the Sabbath'; elaborating upon the importance of Sunday obligation, the need to go to Mass every Sunday to preserve and grow our relationship with God. Then a phrase said, "We should not look the day as a Sunday Obligation, but rather as a Sunday of Opportunity." It's true! Each Sunday is an opportunity; an opportunity to encounter God, an opportunity to receive grace and an opportunity to receive the Eucharist. Over time – as we may have many years of Holy Mass under our belts, we may be tempted to simply go through the motions – but we should remember that each Holy Mass is an opportunity.

Sometimes you may find in a sacristy the following quote for the priest to read, "Celebrate this Mass as if it were your first Mass, your last Mass, your only Mass." In some way this quote, is not only for priests but for all to consider in each and every Mass as it were our first, our last and our only Mass.

- Our 'first Mass' with the observance and wonder to detail (actions, words and gestures) as if it was the first time we were experiencing the Mass.
- As it were 'our last Mass' with the great fervor and devotion of having done this for so long; as if it were the last thing we could do...and we want to do it well for Love of God.
- And our 'only Mass' reminding ourselves that each Mass contains the interminable grace of God and the inexhaustible fount of mercy. Those who lived during the time of Jesus only had one Mass, they only witnessed the sacrifice of Jesus once and had to make the most of the one Holy Mass. We too should make use of it as if it was the only and singular opportunity to receive grace and mercy of God.

Therefore, for this Lenten resolution let us think about offering God a greater and more attentive participation in Holy Mass; as if it were our first, our last and our only Mass.
