PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends,

Lent is just around the corner; we are less than two weeks away. Lent is a yearly observance, and over time we may be tempted to simply go through the motions thus forgetting its purpose and its spiritual benefits. Lent is more than simply decorating the Church in purple linens, and more than simply giving up something for 40 days. Lent has two major purposes:

- It recalls our baptism
- It emphasizes the reminder that penance is purification and preparation

Our baptism was our first disposition in allowing God to be involved in our lives. But this is not a one-time existential choice; but this is a choice that needs to be constantly renewed. Just because I was baptized at the age of 3 months by my parents does not necessarily save me, but it's the constant renewal of these baptismal promises in the attendance of Holy Mass, frequent

confession and – *in this case* – the observance of Lent that renews these baptismal promises.

There are four elements that we should observe throughout the season of lent; (1) Prayer, (2) Abstinence (3) Fasting and (4) Almsgiving. It may appear overwhelming to think we have to do all of them. But in reality, we don't necessarily have to do 5 of each, we simply can do one or two of each and do them well. For example; for **Prayer** (I will pray the Rosary daily or attend mass during the weekdays), for **Abstinence** (I will limit my time on the phone or skip watching sports), for **Fasting** (I will skip a snack I usually eat mid-day or skip meat on Fridays) and for **Almsgiving** (I will consider observing faithfully my tithes to the church or help the Charitable groups). Other propositions could be to arrive to Sunday Mass early or stay a little after in prayer.

Although we may do all of these things — the fruitfulness of this penitential observance is the joy and the faith with which we observe them. I won't say, 'It does not profit us at all', but rather 'It profits us little' if we do these penances and prayers with a reluctant heart. Otherwise, what is supposed to help us open our hearts to God is instead closing it.

Together in prayer!

GOSPEL Mark 1.29-39 of Sunday February 4
