PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends.

As we are drawing closer to Easter Sunday – as the Church calls it" the Solemnity of Solemnities" – we can also remember that there are many (Catechumens) who are preparing themselves to enter into the Catholic Church. Between Sacred Heart and Saint John the Baptist we are happy to have 6 who are entering into full communion with the Catholic Church. It is our responsibility as current members of the Catholic Church to pray for them (for their faith and perseverance in the faith) and to make them feel welcomed into the Church.

The Gospel of Luke says, "...there will be rejoicing among the angels of God over one sinner who repents." (Luke 15:10) There should be joy in each and every one of us for those who have come to accept the faith.

As we pray for them, we can also remind ourselves of the importance of also praying for those who have fallen away from the faith or those who have not yet come to accept the faith. Sometimes we don't realize the power or the effects of our prayers; sometimes God grants us the grace of seeing the fruits of our prayer other times God keeps them hidden. Our Lord keeps them hidden so that we can rely more on faith – know that our prayers are heard although we do not see their effects.

Here is a prayer that can be said for the Catechumens.

"Lord Jesus!

You, who in the most bitter moments of Your passion showed an ardent thirst for souls, grant that we may share in this thirst.

Give us the light to grow in the knowledge of Your word and grant us strength so that, by collaborating in preaching this word at every moment of our lives, we may bring to You, through Your holy Church, and the intercession of Your holy Mother, innumerable souls who live far from the truth. Grant this so that with You, through You and in You, they may be reconciled to the Eternal Father, in union with whom, together with the Holy Spirit, You live and reign forever and ever.

GOSPEL Mark 11.1-10 of Sunday March 24

When they were approaching Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany, near the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately as you enter it, you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden; untie it and bring it. If anyone says to you, 'Why are you doing this?' just say this, 'The Lord needs it and will send it back here immediately.'"

They went away and found a colt tied near a door, outside in the street. As they were untying it, some of the bystanders said to them, "what are you doing, untying the colt?" they disciples told them what Jesus had said; and they allowed them to take it.

Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it; and he sat on it. Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut in the fields.

Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting, "Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the coming kingdom of our father David! Hosanna in the highest heaven!"
