PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends,

We are now in the Season of Ordinary Time! Ordinary Time is often looked upon or considered as a more casual time within the Church as nothing extraordinary happens (no special penance like during Lent, no preparation as in Advent, nor anything special to celebrate as in Easter or Christmas). But despite the other exterior things, Ordinary Time is a special time for growth and greater intimacy with Christ. I often consider the verse from the Gospel of Luke, "The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him." This is our time to grow in wisdom and favor with God as well. One of the principle ways of doing so is through the devoted and often reading of Sacred Scripture.

I would like to share with you a little excerpt of the Imitation of Christ by Thomas Kempis as it may inspire us to pick up scripture more often during Ordinary Time,

"Truth, not eloquence, is to be sought in reading the Holy Scriptures; and every part must be read in the spirit in which it was written. For in the Scriptures we ought to seek profit rather than polished diction.

Likewise, we ought to read simple and devout books as willingly as learned and profound ones. We ought not to be swayed by the authority of the writer, whether he be a great literary light or an insignificant person, but by the love of simple truth. We ought not to ask who is speaking, but mark what is said. Men pass away, but the truth of the Lord remains forever. God speaks to us in many ways without regard for persons.

Our curiosity often impedes our reading of the Scriptures, when we wish to understand and mull over what we ought simply to read and pass by. If you would profit from it, therefore, read with humility, simplicity, and faith, and never seek a reputation for being learned. Seek willingly and listen attentively to the words of the saints; do not be displeased with the sayings of the ancients, for they were not made without purpose."
