4:30 PM: Eucharistic Procession around Sacred Heart

5:30 PM: Holy Mass with Bishop Daniel Miehm

Followed by Reception

We have the opportunity for a Plenary Indulgence either for yourself or for a deceased loved one.

Plenary indulgence is a remission from all temporal punishment due to sin. Offering believers a powerful opportunity to seek God's mercy, cleanse their souls, and draw closer to Divine Things. In other words, a plenary Indulgence saves ourselves (or another) from time in purgatory. All the requirements of the

Plenary indulgence must be met. The requirements for Plenary Indulgence of the Sacred Heart established by Bishop Daniel Miehm are:

1. Attend the Holy Mass of the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus at a Sacred Heart Church, Friday June 7th.
2. Go to Confession within 7 days of the Solemnity Mass.
3. Receive Holy Communion.
4. Pray for the Pope's Intentions.

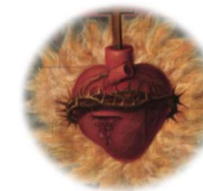
Reliving the Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus according to Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque

GOSPEL Mark 14.12-16, 22-26 of Sun June 2

On the first day of Unleavened Bread, when the Passover lamb is sacrificed, the disciples said to Jesus, "Where do you want us to go and make the preparations for you to eat the Passover?"

So he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, "Go into the city, and a man carrying a jar of water will meet you; follow him, and wherever he enters, say to the owner of the house, 'The Teacher asks, "Where is my guest room where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?"' He will show you a large room upstairs, furnished and ready. Make preparations for us there."

So the disciples set out and went to the city, and found everything as he had told them; and they prepared the Passover meal.

While they were eating, he took a loaf of bread, and after blessing it he broke it, gave it to them, and said, "Take; this is my Body." Then he took a cup, and after giving thanks he gave it to them, and all of them drank from it. He said to them, "This is my Blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many. Truly I tell you, I will never again drink of the fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God."

When they had sung the hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives.
