PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

Today we have two parables: 1- Parable of the Mustard seed and 2- the Parable of the Attitude of a Servant. In the first one, the Apostles exclaimed: "Lord: 'Increase our faith'" And Jesus said: "If you had faith as a grain of mustard seed..." Our Lord here compares faith to a grain of mustard seed because 1) it is the smallest seed, 2) yet it is also the most powerful seed when it grows. Jesus teaches that even if we have but a little true faith, we can still do great things. "If you had faith as a arain of mustard seed you could say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea' and it would obey you" There are two powerful acts, that show the power of faith: 1) the uprooting of the tree from the earth, 2) and the planting of the tree in the sea. THE TREE represents us. THE EARTH symbolizes those who live by the senses, the spirit of the world.

THE SEA symbolizes those who live by the Spirit. Through faith, every tree (each one of us) can be uprooted from its vices and sin (attachment to earth), and be planted in the sea, living according to the Spirit of God. If you live by faith, you can do mighty things, even miracles, like moving this tree from earth to water. But then Jesus warns us against falling into pride. He continues: "Who among you would say to your servant who has just come in from plowing or tending sheep in the field". THE SERVANT is us. THE MASTER OF THE HOUSE is GOD. THE FIELD is the WORLD, and THE HOUSE is the CHURCH Here is the connection of the two parables. If you live by faith you will do very good actions like PLOWING and TENDING SHEEP: a) plowing, means how we deal with faith with inanimate creatures (not living). b) tending the sheep, means how we deal with faith with living creatures. "Coming back from the field" to the House means 'coming from the world to Church' "He would not say rest... would he not rather say to him, 'Prepare me **something to eat'** to God. Notice that the servant works in the field and in the house as well. "Put on your apron" The apron symbolizes humility and service. "Gird yourself" is to collect the mind by doing a self-examination of the works you have done. Through self-examination we check the intention of our works: either we did it for the praise of man or for the glory of God. By examining, we rectify our conscience and direct all our works to the glory of God. And THIS IS THE WAY WE PREPARE THE SUPPER FOR THE LORD. Once we directed all our works to God, then, we can enjoy the good things for the glory of God "And afterward you shall eat and drink"

CONCLUSION "So should it be with you. When you have done all you have been commanded say, We are unprofitable servants, we have done what we were obliged to do" Let us ask the Blessed Virgin Mary for faith and for the grace to direct all our intentions to God.

GOSPEL Luke 17.5-10 of Sunday October 5

The Apostles said to the Lord, "Increase our faith!" The Lord replied, "If you had faith the size of a mustard seed, you could say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you.

"Who among you would say to your slave who has just come in from ploughing or tending sheep in the field, 'Come here at once and take your place at the table'? Would you not rather say to him, 'Prepare supper for me, put on your apron and serve me while I eat and drink; later you may eat and drink'? Do you thank the slave for doing what was commanded? So you also, when you have done all that you were ordered to do, say, 'We are worthless slaves; we have done only what we ought to have done!"
